## QUALIFICATIONS & PATHWAYS

A range of qualifications are offered by the Institute, from bridging and entry level programs through to advanced diplomas and degrees.

Most of the courses offer nationally recognised qualifications and many of the courses available offer pathways into further study, including university.

The qualifications delivered at DIT are nationally recognised by other training providers, such as Public Training Providers, and by employers throughout Australia.

### CERTIFICATES I AND II

- Entry level qualifications giving you basic employability skills.
- Usually takes 6 months each to complete.

### CERTIFICATE III

- You may find employment at junior to intermediate levels.
- Usually takes 6 months to complete.
- Can be a re-entry point for those wanting to return to study or work.

### CERTIFICATE IV

- Prepares you to take limited responsibility for others, usually in a supervisory role.
- Minimum required for consideration of entry into university.
- Usually takes 12 months to complete.

### DIPLOMA AND ADVANCED DIPLOMA

- Prepares you to work autonomously as a professional or manager.
- May provide you with credits towards a university qualification.
- Diploma usually takes 6-12 months after completing Certificate IV.
- Advanced Diploma usually takes 6-12 months after completing Diploma.

### GRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN MANAGEMENT

- A post graduate qualification for existing managers.
- Graduate Certificate can take approximately 1 year to complete part time.

## STUDY MODE OPTIONS

### FULL AND PART TIME CLASSES

Full time study consists of 16 - 20 hours of classes per week. In addition to this you may be required to complete study or assignments in your own time. Most classes will be scheduled during the day but some courses do have evening classes.

If you would prefer to study part time this may also be an option. Some courses are offered part time or you can enrol in a full time course but choose to study only a couple of units at a time.

### FLEXIBLE LEARNING AND ONLINE LEARNING

Many clients are unable to participate in face-to-face classes. Whether it is due to the distance from campus, work commitments or personal preference, Durack can provide training opportunities through flexible learning and online learning.

Flexible Learning allows you to study in your own home or workplace at a time and pace that suits you and your lifestyle. It is a way of studying that allows you to acquire and update skills without setting foot on the campus. Opportunities exist in some course for flexible students to attend workshops on campus.

You can enrol in a single unit or a full time course (where available) according to your study needs. Flexible Learning options may include printed, CD and online materials. These materials are designed to be easy to understand and activities are simple to follow. Students are supported by tutors and in many regional centres can access the facilities of the local Community Resource Centre. Online learners also receive support from lecturers via e-mail and web conferencing and can communicate with other students studying the same qualification.

### OPEN LEARNING

Open Learning is a mixture of flexible and face to face study. You have the opportunity to mix off campus study with some units on campus in class, so offering you the best of both worlds.

### EMPLOYMENT BASED TRAINING

**Traineeships:** Generally a traineeship is a structured program for 12 months or more on a full time or part time basis. A trainee gains work experience with an employer and has the opportunity to learn new skills in a hands on environment.

**Apprenticeships:** Generally an apprenticeship is a structured program of 3½ years that leads you to becoming a qualified tradesperson. The majority of the training takes place on the job with an employer but you will also be required to do blocks of off the job training at the Durack campus.

**Pre Apprenticeships:** These courses can assist in gaining an offer of an apprenticeship from an employer.

### RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) recognises your life and work experiences, education or other training which can be transferred to a Nationally Accredited Qualification. RPL assists in employment opportunities for a promotion or a pathway to further studies. If you would like more information about RPL please contact a lecturer in your industry area.

## COURSE ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

Most qualifications have entrance requirements. Entrance requirements may be skills and knowledge obtained through secondary school results, other qualifications or experience within industry. Depending on the qualification a level of communication & maths skills are necessary.

When applying or enrolling you will be required to produce material to confirm you have the adequate communication or math levels to complete the qualification. If you are unable to produce the appropriate information the Lecturer will organise an assessment to assess your level.

Durack Institute of Technology also offers bridging or entry level programs which can assist you to meet the entry requirements of higher level courses.

### SELECTION CRITERIA

Applications are judged against selection criteria when there are more people applying for a course, than there are places available. Selection criteria may include work experience, school grades or other studies.

Durack Institute of Technology also offers bridging or entry level programs which can assist you to meet the entry requirements of higher level courses.

### LANGUAGE, LITERACY AND NUMERACY SUPPORT

Adequate language, literacy and numeracy skills are required for successful study. A range of options is available to students who feel they may need additional support in these areas.

There are opportunities to have your level of skills assessed, including assessment prior to enrolment, to determine if you require additional help. You can discuss these opportunities with a member of the client services team or a lecturer

### RECOGNITION OF PREVIOUS QUALIFICATIONS

#### CREDIT TRANSFER

If you have completed previous studies at Durack Institute of Technology, you may be eligible for a credit transfer from your previous studies to your current studies. You can discuss this with your lecturer.

#### NATIONAL RECOGNITION

If you have completed studies at another registered training organisation (RTO), they will be recognised by Durack Institute of Technology. To gain your recognition, you will need to provide copies of your Academic Record and Certificate, or Statement of Attainment issued by your previous RTO to your lecturer.

## COURSE FEES AND CHARGES

Fees apply to most Institute courses. The cost of fees will vary according to the course however all fees and charges for courses must be paid at the time of enrolment. As a guide one semester at Durack costs a approximately \$600 (\$300 with a concession) plus book and material costs. Some courses have higher material costs than others.

Durack sets its fees and charges according to the Department of Training and Workforce Development Fees and Charges Guidelines and has in place a policy to protect fees paid in advance by clients.

### LOW ON CASH?

To assist students in cases of financial hardship the Institute may offer an instalment plan, where a minimum deposit is paid at enrolment and the remainder of the fees are paid in regular instalments. To discuss arranging an instalment plan please contact the Manager Client Services or Manager Training Support Services

### REFUNDS

The Institute has a refunds policy. To be eligible for a refund you will need to complete an Application for Withdrawal and Refund form, available from Training Support Services. Generally you will be eligible for a partial refund provided you officially withdraw from your course within four weeks of commencing your first unit of study. ## OTHER FACILITIES

### ATM

An ATM is located in the Canteen for the Geraldton staff and students to access during Canteen operating hours. A \$2 fee applies to transactions.

### PUBLIC TELEPHONE

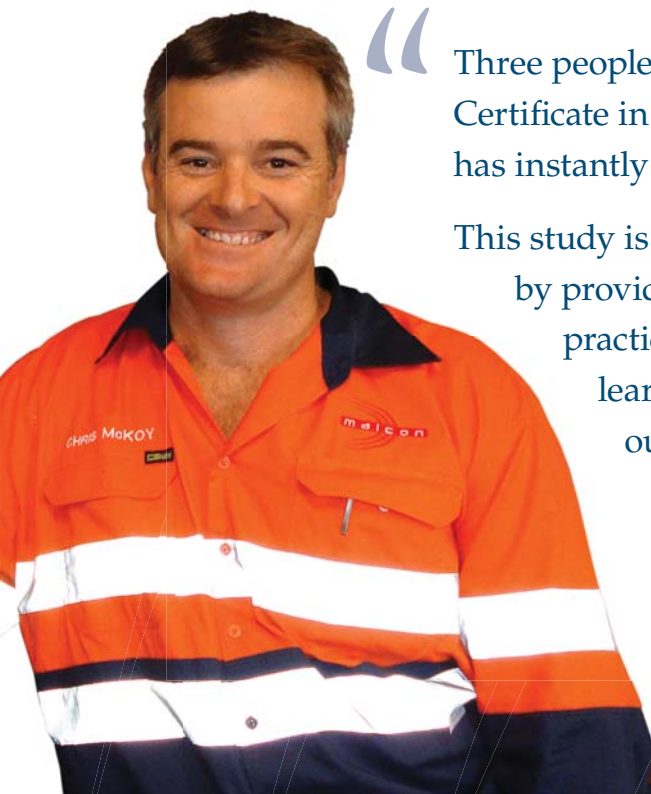
