

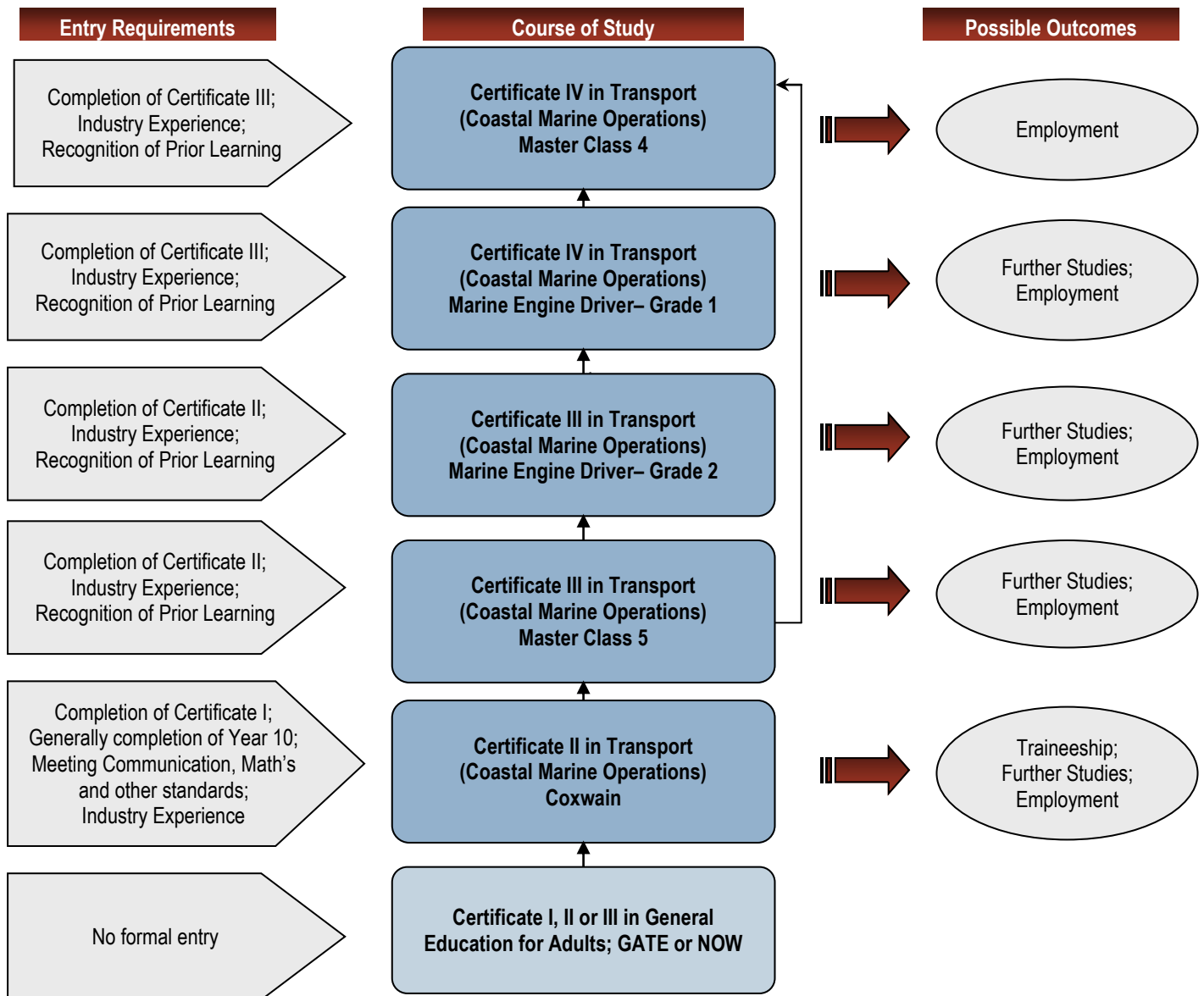
Interested in a career in the Marine Transport industry? (Coastal Marine Operations)

These qualification at the starting point will provide the practical skills and knowledge to take charge of a commercial vessel of less than 12 metres in length operating within the limits of sheltered and inshore waters, within 15 nautical miles of the coast. You will learn skill in nautical navigation, maintenance and engineering, marine radio operation, first aid, and safety at sea.

The employment opportunities available within the industry include roles such as:

Entry level seagoing employment, opportunity to become a Master Class 4 or an Officer of the Watch with the commercial shipping industry, Entry level sea going employment e.g. deckhand or aquaculture worker, Provide you with a license to be the chief engineer of a vessel with engineer power less than 750 kw in Australian Coastal Operations or a Marine engine driver.

The following shows how you can achieve your goal and the various pathways that you can take.

What are the entrance requirements?

Entrance requirements are the lowest level of school results you need to be allowed into a full-time course at Durack Institute of Technology.

Entrance requirements will be either:

A lower level qualification, for example, to enrol in a Certificate IV in Disability Work you need a Certificate III in Disability Work

OR

Communication skills and if required math skills

The level of communication and math skills required for entry to a course will be measured according to the following scale:

- Basic skills
- Developed skills
- Well Developed skills
- Highly Developed skills
