

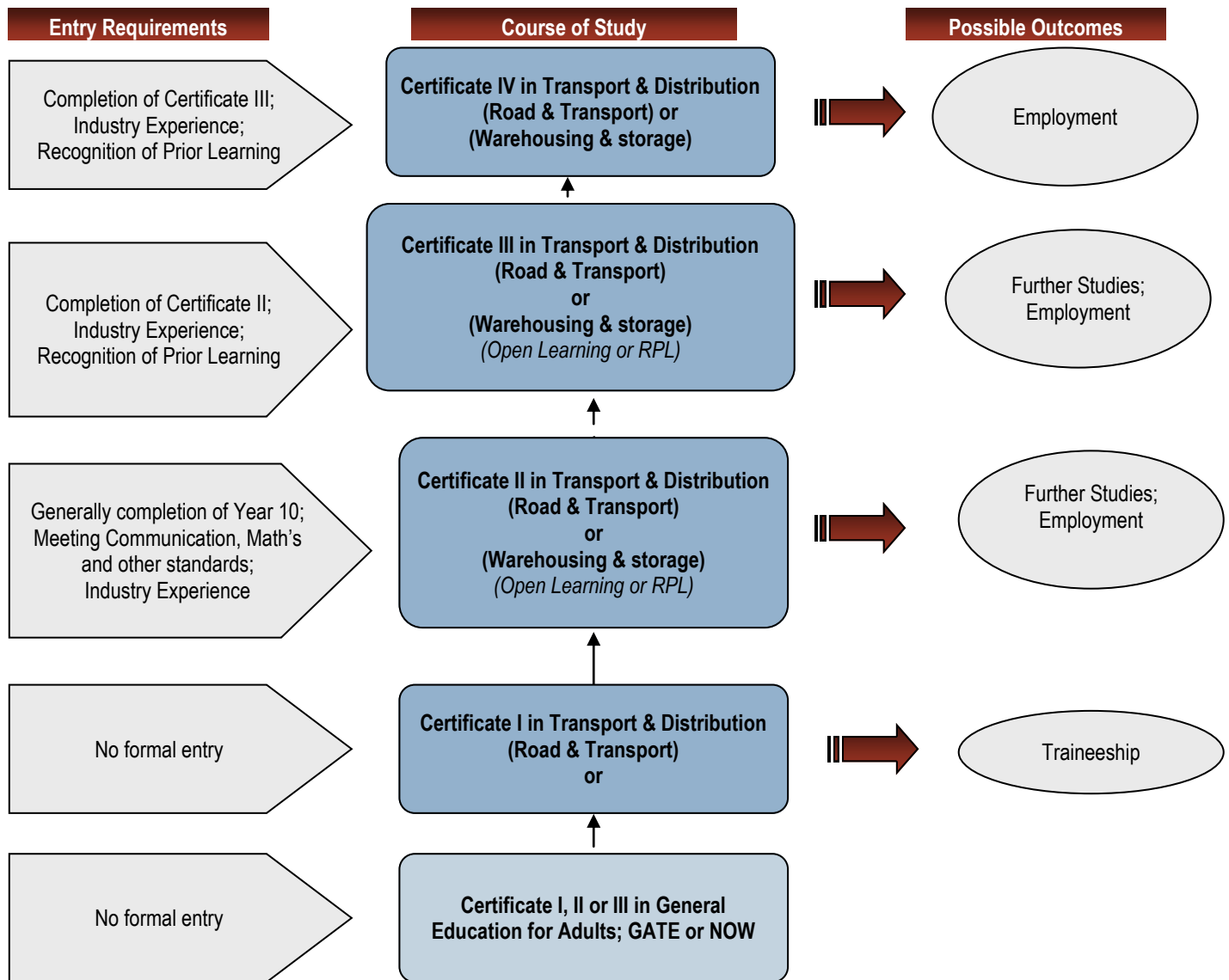
Interested in a career in the Transport and Distribution industry?

(Road & Transport and Warehousing & Storage)

Road & Transport: Completion of these qualifications will provide you with the practical skills and knowledge to move stock or transport passengers between destinations by road. You will learn skills to handle stock safely, operate vehicles carrying special loads, organise despatch and receive operations, estimate / calculate mass, area and quantity dimensions and implement and monitor OH & S procedures. You will also learn about security and emergency procedures, maintaining freight records and leading a small team.

Warehouse & Storage: Completion of these qualifications, from Certificate I to Certificate IV will provide you with a range of practical skills and knowledge from the coordination of goods for distribution to customers to plan and monitor the storage of goods or freight, to developing plans to meet customer and organisational needs and coordinate the management of workplace data. You will learn how to use inventory systems to conduct stock counts, and apply product knowledge to organise receives and dispatches. You will also learn to market service and products to clients, apply statistics and facilitate work teams.

The following shows how you can achieve your goal and the various pathways that you can take.

What are the entrance requirements?

Entrance requirements are the lowest level of school results you need to be allowed into a full-time course at Durack Institute of Technology.

Entrance requirements will be either:

A lower level qualification, for example, to enrol in a Certificate IV in Disability Work you need a Certificate III in Disability Work

OR

Communication skills and if required math skills.

The level of communication and math skills required for entry to a course will be measured according to the following scale:

- Basic skills
- Developed skills
- Well Developed skills
- Highly Developed skills
